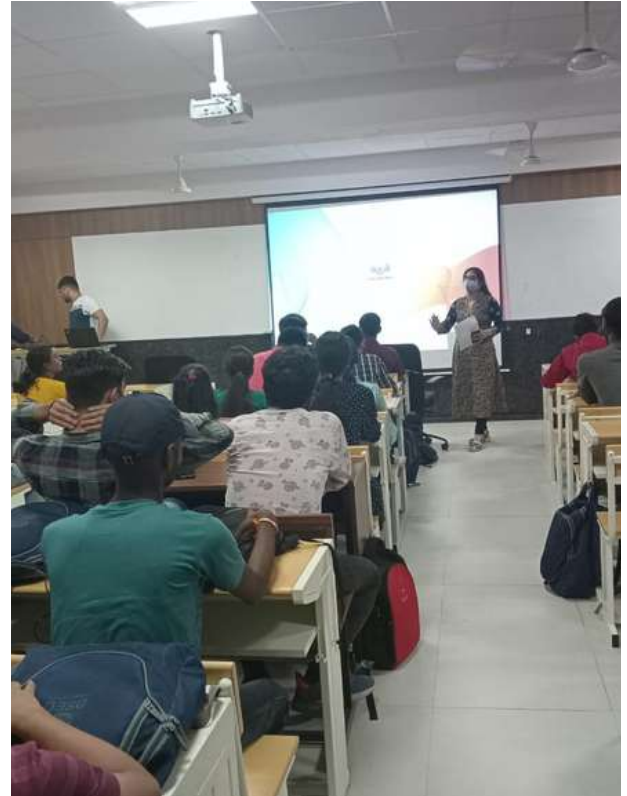

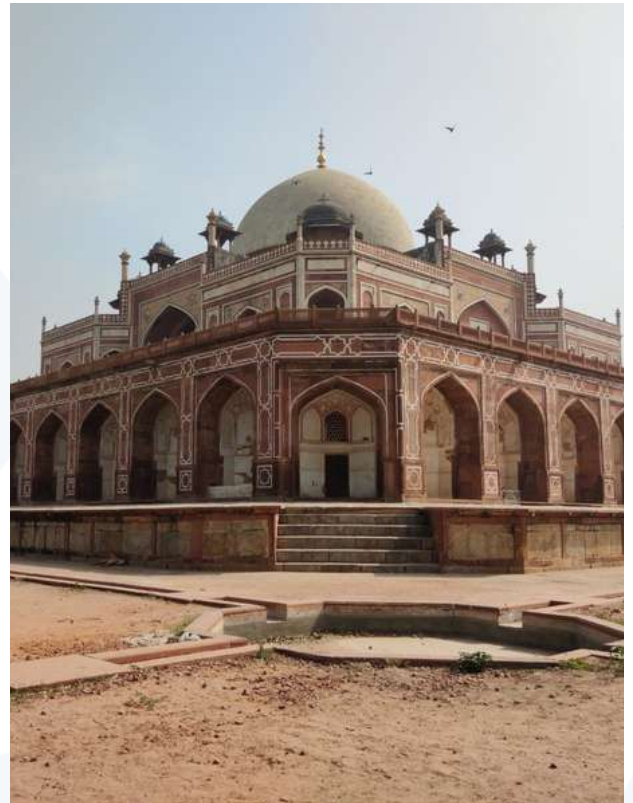

Air pollution has no boundaries it can harm anyone. It is classified as most dangerous environmental weapon, has potential to kill many people. The toxic gases in our air puts our health at risk with every breath we take. The ingredients of this noxious mix are harmful gases and fine particles which has long-term deleterious health effects.

According to many researchers, exposure to these particles can even reduce life expectancy. In India, the main causes of air pollution are crop stubble burning, poor waste management, vehicular emissions, construction-generated dust, inadequate tree coverage, and emissions from unorganized industrial clusters with poor regulatory control. As a result, some of the most polluted cities in the world today are in India. Every year, India bears the brunt of large-scale economic losses resulting from increased welfare costs and a depleted productive workforce due to air pollution. According to WHO, living in toxic air pollution levels can cause cancer, heart disease, strokes, respiratory infections and pulmonary diseases. Poor, children and the elderly, are most vulnerable subset of our population. A Lancet study has shown that the country's average life expectancy has been lowered by 1.7 years as of 2017 due to air pollution. Vehicular pollution, crop burning, industrial emissions, dust from construction, thermal power plants, poor waste management, and the use of unclean fuels in impoverished households all contribute to India's bad air, but can be limited with the right interventions. In order to tackle the issue, the government and Indian citizens must work together to

curb this problem. Such a challenge must be met with stringent steps to ensure that beating air pollution is a major national priority. The National Clean Air Program (NCAP) has been launched by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change in January 2019 in the hopes of improving the national air quality monitoring network, capacity for the management of air pollution, and public awareness about the hazardous consequences of bad air. We can demand change of ourselves, each other and our government to ensure that these targets are achieved.

The greatest threat to air quality is that everyone thinks someone else will improve it. We all can participate and contribute in improving the situation, as a responsible citizen seek out information about the major pollutants around you and use this awareness to engage your community and encourage responsibility amongst others around you. The importance of collective action cannot be stressed enough; a shared sentiment about environmental responsibility is the only way to see rapid change in our large, developing nation with a burgeoning population. Indian citizens must demand accountability from the country leaders, and must also make lifestyle changes to reduce the damage being caused to the air, our most precious resource.

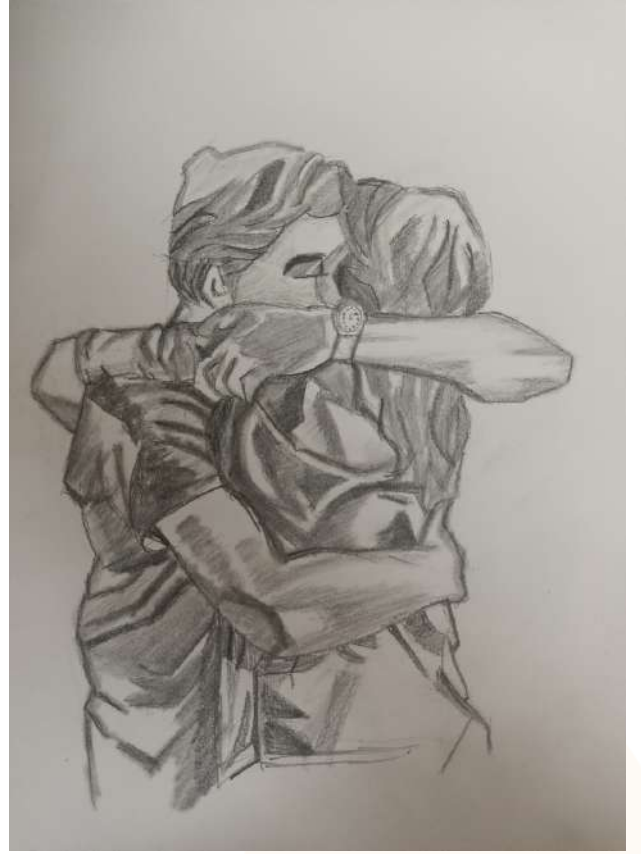
